Bhai-Lang is a new programming language developed by two Indian developers - Rishabh Tripathi from Groww and Aniket Singh from Amazon. The code of the programming language begins with "hi bhai", while it ends with "bye bhai". Netizens are amused by this toy programming language.

Like other programming languages, "Bhai-Lang" too has syntax. As per the official website of the language, all codes written inside these tags will be valid while everything outside of it will be ignored. The code begins with "hi bhai", while it ends with "bye bhai". If there is any error, "Arre Bhai Bhai Bhai!!!" message will appear.

On the website's playground feature, users are allowed to play around with the code, so that they can execute commands and tasks using "Bhai-lang". The screenshots of the programming language are doing rounds on social media. "bye bhai". If there is any error, "Arre Bhai Bhai Bhai!!!" message will appear.

Elon Musk's Starlink app becomes most- downloaded in Ukraine: Report



Elon Musk-owned Starlink's app was the most-downloaded app in Ukraine on Monday afternoon after reaching the top spot on Sunday, media reports said. Sensor Tower said the app was downloaded 21,000 times globally Sunday across Apple and Google app stores, of which most downloads came from Ukraine. It has been downloaded nearly 1,00,000 times in Ukraine according to Sensor Tower.

Starlink provides high-speed, low-latency broadband internet across the globe. Using advanced satellites in a low orbit, Starlink enables video calls, online gaming, streaming, and other high data rate activities.

Harvard student launches website for Ukrainian refugees after 3 sleepless nights

Avi Schiffmann, a 19-year-old neurophilosophy student at Harvard University, launched the website 'Ukraine Take Shelter' with his friend Marco Burstein to help Ukrainian refugees to find temporary places to stay. It connects Ukrainian refugees with potential hosts and housing from around the world. "We didn't sleep for three days, we got it (website) up as fast as possible," Schiffmann said.



First drone school inaugurated in Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior

Madhya Pradesh CM Shivraj Singh Chouhan and Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia inaugurated the first "drone school" in Gwalior on Thursday. Chouhan said that this is the first of the five drone schools that have been planned in the state. He added that the use of drones will increase in the coming times and will create employment opportunities.



RBI launches UPI for feature phones; transactions won't require internet



RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das has launched a UPI-based payment product for feature phones called UPI123Pay. The product will allow customers to use feature phones for almost all transactions, except scan and pay, and it doesn't need an internet connection for transactions. This will help PCI reach its goal of processing a billion transactions a day, the RBI said.

Microsoft to set up its largest Indian data centre region in Hyderabad



Microsoft on Monday said it plans to establish its largest Indian data centre region in Hyderabad, with its first phase expected to become operational by 2025. Microsoft India President Anant Maheshwari said the company is making long-term investments and that it has doubled its existing three data centres capacity.

"A Microsoft datacenter region provides a competitive advantage to our digital economy and is a long-term investment in our country's potential. The cloud is transforming every industry and sector. The investment in skilling will empower India's workforce today and into the future," said Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Minister of State for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.

"We already serve more than 3,40,000 companies in India," he said.

Ukraine-Russia War Threatens The American Investors



The ongoing Russia-Ukraine war is degrading Americans' financial outlook, sparking the desire to save more and postpone investing, according to a survey from MassMutual.

But the financial experts say that steering clear of stock market volatility may be a mistake. While two-thirds of Americans worry the conflict will hurt their wallets, with nearly half eager to save more cash and 42% delaying investments, the report found.

"For a year that started with such hope and optimism, many are extremely concerned about the U.S. economy," said Amanda Wallace, head of insurance operations with MassMutual, pointing to stress about day-to-day expenses and financial insecurity

Telangana to back for education of students returned from Ukraine

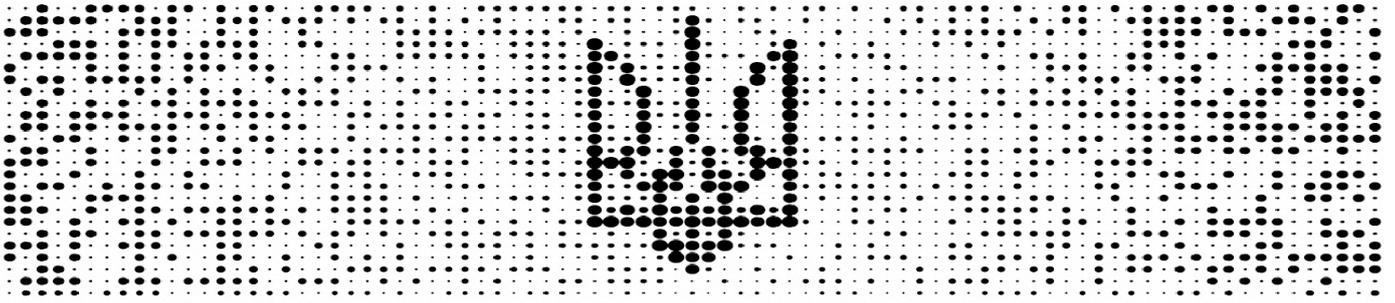


The Telangana government announced that it will provide the educational expenses of over 700 students brought back from war-torn Ukraine to enable them to complete their medical education in India.

Chief Minister K. Chandrababu Naidu told the Assembly that the state government will write to the Central Government to give permission to 740 students who were forced to discontinue their education and return home from Ukraine to complete their MBBS course in India.

He also added that since the students face an uncertain future due to the current situation in Ukraine, the state government is ready to bear the expenses to help them complete their MBBS.

Ukraine launches a NFT 'Museum of War' for crypto fundraising

Ukraine started auctioning off a collection of non-fungible tokens (NFTs) in an expansion of a cryptocurrency fundraising push that has already collected more than \$65 million for its war effort.

The 'Meta History: Museum of War' collection is a series of digital images - including silhouettes of warplanes, screengrabs of news reports and a cartoon-style image of an explosion - each one marking a different day in the conflict.

Ukraine's Ministry of Digital Transformation started appealing for donations in digital tokens such as bitcoin and ether three days after Russia launched its invasion, which Moscow calls a "special military operation".

Tata Motors Launch Mobile Showrooms: "ANUBHAV"



Tata Motors recently launched a mobile showroom facility named "Anubhav" based on the Tata Intra V10. Tata developed a total of 103 of the Anubhav mobile showrooms across the country.

These mobile showrooms will help existing dealerships offer a doorstep sales experience to customers and assist them with information about all Tata cars, accessories, avail finance schemes, book a test drive and evaluate existing cars for exchange.

Tata said that a total of 40% of passenger car sales comes from rural areas and this initiative will help them increase their reach in Tehsils and Talukas. Tata is going to fit these mobile showrooms with GPS trackers to monitor the movement for better utilisation.

Govt working on crypto classification under GST law

The Centre is considering the classification of cryptocurrency under the GST law so that tax can be levied on the entire value of the transaction.

At present, 18% Goods and Services Tax is levied only on services provided by crypto exchanges and is categorised as financial services. GST officers told the PTI news agency that cryptocurrencies are similar to casinos, gambling, betting, which have 28% of the GST on the entire value.

The GST has not yet clearly made a classification of cryptocurrency. In the absence of a law regulating such virtual digital currencies, the classification has to take into account whether the law classifies it as an actionable claim.

The 2022-23 Budget has brought in clarity with regard to the levy of income tax on crypto assets.

India expected to have over 100+ new unicorns in 2022

Accelerated funding activity is expected to create over 100+ unicorns in India during 2022.

According to HDFC Securities, one unicorn has been added for every 5 days within the first 2 months of 2022 and funding activities have created 42 unicorns in 2021.

In financial parlance, a startup is considered to have become a unicorn once it achieves a value of over \$1 billion. Furthermore, India saw record fund inflows of \$66 billion across 2.1K deals in 2021.



Zomato to acquire Blinkit in stock deal;



Zomato Ltd is set to take control of Blinkit after the food aggregator extended a \$150 million emergency loan facility to the quick commerce startup.

The deal value is significantly lower than the unicorn status which “Blinkit” achieved after getting more than \$120 million from Zomato and investor Tiger Global Management. Zomato owns about 10% of Blinkit. The pared-down valuation indicates Blinkit (run by Grofers India Pvt. Ltd) may be struggling to sustain the 10-minute delivery of groceries.
